

SYLLABUS

TITLE: Advanced Writing

CODIFICATION: ESP 227

PREREQUISITE: ESP 106

CREDITS: 3 credits | 3 contact hours | 1 term

DESCRIPTION:

An advanced course that emphasizes teaching investigation techniques that will help the student to write well-reasoned argumentative essays.

JUSTIFICATION

Being able to write correctly, with clarity and precision is essential in any field of study in this day and age. Dominating the expression of the written word is a process that grows in complexity and demands constant refinement in every step of the way. That is why it is important for every student to enroll in a course that reinforces their knowledge of the theoretical and practical aspects of writing, as well as the value of investigation and the abilities that will allow them to find their own voice as writers.

The course develops in the student the following competences:

OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course the student will be able to:

- 1. Master the principal skills required for writing and developing expositional and argumentative essays.
- 2. Know and identify the theoretical elements of the essay (content, structure, and purpose), in both the informal-creative style and the formal style.
- 3. Recognize and acknowledge the importance of having different perspectives and ideologies present in argumentative essays.
- 4. Identify and consider the ethical value in the assigned reading material, as well as during the development of an argumentative essay.
- 5. Recognize the importance of the investigation process in order to write a well-documented essay.
- 6. Use and apply all the necessary techniques when writing an essay that requires investigation.
- 7. Identify the adequate language in order to adapt an essay so it can reach different audiences.
- 8. Identify and correct any mistakes or frequent error during the development of an essay.
- 9. Apply basic correcting and draft editing skills.
