DESCRIPTION

The course integrates the theoretical and practical concepts of the core education curriculum into the discipline of Nursing. It synthesizes the legal-ethical concepts related to leadership and general nursing roles. It also includes aspects of critical thinking, research, trends and controversies in the profession, interdisciplinary communication, technological advances, safety, and image of the nursing professional. Emphasizes values and value-based behaviors as a member of a profession. It discusses the theoretical and programmatic controversies of professional nursing and the practice of evidence-based health care, cultural diversity, and research. It demonstrates the development of the nurse practitioner that encompasses lifelong learning, social and gender controversies, and exemplifies the values of the profession. In addition, the assessment of professional competencies is integrated.

JUSTIFICATION

The Nursing faculty, in accordance with Universidad del Sagrado Corazón's philosophy, has designed this course with the purpose of integrating the concepts of the core education curriculum into the nursing profession. This helps students advance as professionals and become familiar with the trends and controversies that reign in this all-

encompassing science.

COMPETENCES, LEVEL IV
